You are still welcome to come look at the cattle on campus, however I would encourage you to utilize the pictures and videos we have posted on our facebook page. If you do not have access to facebook prior to the sale let me know so we can make accomodations. I would like to say thank you to all that showed interest, bid, and bought cattle out of our inaugural sale last year. I have been working on making this year's offering even better. The inaugural sale was featured on females and will continue to be the focus of the sale but this year we are offering a few herd bulls. We will be offering our first Beefmaster female and Fleckveih genetics to go along with our Registered Angus. Another new addition this year is the AU Animal Health Research herd has put together a really good set of commercial heifers selling 3-4 head per lot. I tried to make sure we had something for everyone and will continue to do so. I have spent the last 14 years as manager of this herd building the cows to thrive on grass, be low input, and maternally oriented. We do send all of our steers to the AU Meat Lab so I do keep carcass traits in mind but I believe in balance in terms of breeding- not going to extremes on EPD's, carcass traits, or frame size. I believe this offering is diverse but still holds true in that the cattle are good, functional, and will work for you. I appreciate your interest in our genetics and again thank you to all our past customers.

All cattle are up to date on vaccinations, dewormed in March, and additional herd health information is available upon request. Health Certificates will be provided for any out of state shipment. The bred females are guaranteed bred, projected calving dates based off pregnancy check by AU Vet School. We are a forage-based program and do not creep feed, we weaned 3/5/20 and started calves on feed (Soyhull & Corn Gluten pellet mix). The weaned bulls are not freeze branded, if you want them branded before you pick up just let us know. The cattle will need to be picked up by May 1st and pay when you pick up animals at AU Beef Teaching Unit unless other arrangements are made prior to sale. The cattle sell under the standard terms and conditions recommended by the American Angus Association. Don't hesitate to call or email if you have questions or need additional information.
